THE EVERETT C. FOX, MD LECTURESHIP POLICY

I. The Award

The Everett C. Fox, MD Lectureship was formed through a bequest from the estate of Everett C. Fox, MD. Dr. Fox had been a practicing clinician in Texas and was vice president of the American Academy of Dermatology in 1946. The selected lecturer will receive a cash award of \$10,000 and present a lecture of approximately 30 minutes at the summer meeting of the American Academy of Dermatology.

II. The Criteria

- a. The individual selected must be a dermatologist.
- b. The recipient should be an acknowledged, expert clinician.
- c. The emphasis must be in selecting a person who is a practicing clinical dermatologists (including dermatopathologists and dermatologic surgeons) regardless of their area of practice.
- d. There should be no emphasis on a particular age group.
- e. The recipient must have proven communication skills.

III. The Selection Process

- a. Requests for nominations will be solicited from the Academy membership at large.
- b. The recipient will be selected by the Named Lectureship Task Force and presented to the Scientific Assembly Committee for approval at the Summer (ACADEMY) Planning Meeting, which is held in the Fall of the year prior to the presentation of the lecture.
